The basics of framing:

- Check the [Getting the Most from your Mobile camera settings guide](#) to set your phone camera up to take the best photos and videos.
- Always film in landscape, it let's us see more!
- Eye level – hold your phone at the height of the person you're filming. If their eyes are near the top grid line, you've nailed it.
- Head space – make sure you leave a little space above someone's head.
- Keep it steady! If you're filming yourself, prop your phone against something to hold it upright.

Open space in background

Outside in natural light with sun behind



Let there be light: Use the sun, sit near a window, or turn on some lamps

- We want to see people's faces, so try not to cast them in shadow.
- Let the sun do all the work! Natural light is best, but try to avoid direct sunlight being in the shot.
- When you're indoors, position yourself near a window with the light casting on your face.
- As long as you can see it clearly on your phone screen, you should be okay!
- Don't forget you can tap your screen to adjust the brightness for a specific area.



Show off your surroundings: What's in the background is important too, we want to see what's making you smile!

- The background might be important, like in the image below of a boy playing crazy golf.
- Or the background isn't important and you want to focus on the people and what they're doing – but the background does help add to the memory, like in the image below of the children hugging in front of the brightly coloured beach huts.



Sound: It's just as important as video

- What we hear in a video is just as important as what we see, especially if you're talking!
- Try and find a spot out of the wind and isn't too noisy.
- If you've propped your phone up you could use something else to block the wind, or use your hand if you're filming someone else.
- Always double check your sound! Do a quick test recording and listen back it.

Ideas of things to film and take photos of on holiday

If you love talking to the camera:

- Film each other packing – what's everyone bringing?
- A selfie video getting on the bus/train – tell us where you're going!
- When you first arrive at your holiday home – maybe give us a tour?
- Tell us how you're feeling before, during, and after your holiday. Really show us the difference it makes!

If you'd rather stay behind the lens:

- Film out of the window while you're travelling, show where you are and where you're going.
- Take a toy with you and film their holiday!
- The views from where you're staying.

Ultimately, there are two important things to remember:

- If you want to remember it, film it!
- Focus on enjoying yourselves, and just point the camera in the right direction!
